

Cognitive Neuroscience Research Study



Volunteers are needed for studies that investigate brain activity and cognition. The studies involve monitoring activity of the brain while performing simple tasks. In order to measure brain activity, you will be asked to lie inside a magnetic resonance (MR) scanner so that images of your brain can be obtained during task performance.

Studies take place at MGH in Charlestown, MA. The study takes up to two hours in the scanner and up to two hours outside the scanner to complete. You will be reimbursed \$25 per hour for participation and an additional \$5 for transportation expenses OR cost of parking will be covered.

In order to take part, you must be:

- 18-35 years of age
- right-handed
- in good general health (no metal implants, no history of depression)
- a Native English speaker
- not pregnant
